1. What Does God Have To Do With My Life?

John 2:1-12 (Each person read one verse, go in a circle)

The next day there was a wedding celebration in the village of Cana in Galilee. Jesus' mother was there, ² and Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the celebration. ³ The wine supply ran out during the festivities, so Jesus' mother told him, "They have no more wine."

4"Dear woman, that's not our problem," lesus replied. "My time has not yet come." 5 But his mother told the servants, "Do whatever he tells you."

⁶ Standing nearby were six stone water jars, used for lewish ceremonial washing. Each could hold twenty to thirty gallons. 7 Jesus told the servants, "Fill the jars with water." When the jars had been filled, 8 he said, "Now dip some out, and take it to the master of ceremonies." So the servants followed his instructions.

Roll Time #1... Go in a circle, roll the dice, have the person who rolled answer the question, then go to the next person.

- 1. Have you been to a wedding before? When? What was it like? If not, make something up!
- What would be your ultimate choice of food and dessert at a wedding?
- 3. Wine and great stuff to eat and drink are key to a great wedding, why do you think they ran out early?
- 4. How do you think the person running the wedding celebration felt when they ran out of wine?
- 5. How do you think the people attending the wedding celebration felt when they ran out of wine?
- 6. Why do you think lesus was at a wedding? Who invites lesus to a wedding?!

Recap: A crisis happened at a wedding... Everyone wanted to know what Jesus would do in this situation.

Roll Time #2

- 1. Why do you think everyone started turning to Jesus when they ran out of wine?
- 2. Where did you get your own impression and information about lesus in your life so far?
- 3. Jesus filled the huge jars with water. What fun would a bunch of water add to the celebration?
- 4. What does water taste like? How yummy is it? Rate it on a scale of 1-10 of yum-
- 5. If this ended with Jesus handing out water, what would this tell us about Jesus?
- Why do you think the servants simply obeyed lesus, to bring something silly like water to the person in charge when what they needed was wine?

Recap: Jesus steps into this issue but does something unexpected. They wanted wine, but Jesus talks to the overlooked servants to do something with water, not wine.

Try This...

Hand out a bottle of water to each person. Take a sip of the water. Then add in a flavor add-in (Mio/Kool-Aid squirt liquid/etc.) and have everyone take a sip.

Roll Time #3

- 2. Jesus changed the water into wine. What does this tell us about Jesus?
- 3. Why do you think it is important that the wine Jesus created was the very best wine anyone had ever tasted?
- 4. Could Jesus have left the problem alone or ignored the request? Why do you think Jesus did this miracle?
- 5. This was the first miracle Jesus' close friends, the disciples, ever saw. What do you think this experience was like for them?
- 6. On a scale of 1-10, how powerful would you say Jesus is... then... and today? Why?

Recap: Jesus is no mere man; he did a miracle right in front of their eyes. He cared about their problem and helped in an unexpected way.

Listen Up!

Have a leader take I-2 minutes to answer this question: What is an example/story of when Jesus has been powerful in your life? [Optional: after the leader talks, a student can answer the question too]

30 Seconds of Silence & Text

Ask the following questions and then everyone take 30 seconds of silence to talk to God silently.

- I. Where in your life would you like to see Jesus' power?
- 2. Any other things you would like your leader to be praying for you this week? If you feel comfortable, take 2 minutes and text the answers to these questions to your leader, or simply write them on a slip of paper who will pray for them this week.

Reflect

Take a moment to reflect and journal in your own words on this question:

Where in your life would you like to see Jesus' power?

Mixers and Games with Dice

Pass the Pig

Goal: Be the first player to reach 100 points.

How to play: On a turn, a player rolls the die repeatedly until either:

- I. A "I" is rolled
- 2. The player chooses to "hold" (stop rolling)

If a "I" is rolled, that player's turn ends and no points are earned.

If the player chooses to hold, all of the points rolled during that turn are added to his or her score.

Climb the Mountain

<u>Goal</u>: Be the first one to climb and descend the mountain.

How to play: On a turn, a player rolls the dice and hopes for a "I", which will allow him to cross the number "I" off his mountain.

5 6 5 4 4 3 3 2 2

He must ascend in numerical order, so cannot cross off the "2" until he has crossed off the "1".

If he rolls a "1" and a "2", however, he can cross both numbers off in one turn. Play continues until someone has made it all the way up their mountain and down the other side in the correct order. It is helpful to get scrap paper and draw something similar to the number-mountain shown.

<u>Variation of the same game</u>: For a quicker game, allow the players to add their dice together to produce another number. For example, a throw of I and 2 would allow that player to cross off the I, the 2 and the 3, all in one turn.

Twenty-One

Goal: Use math to get as close to 21 as possible.

How to play: Roll three times and remember all three numbers (you may want to write them down). Use addition, subtraction, multiplication or a combination to make a number as close to 21 as possible. You earn one point if my number is closer to 21 than my partner's. You earn two points if you get exactly 21.


